DESIGN FOR FLY-TRAPS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **6.968**, dated October 28, 1873; application filed September 22, 1873. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DAVID K. THOMPSON, of Clark, in the county of Mercer and State of Pennsylvania, have invented certain new Design for Fly-Traps; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawings which form part of this specification.

This invention has relation to a novel design for a fly-trap, embracing the following features:

A conical wire-gauze top, A, a cylindrical box, C, encircled by a flanged ring, D, and perforated in the sides, inverted conical tubes

E' between the box C and top A, and a foot or standard, E, all as shown in the accompanying drawing.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by

Letters Patent, is—

The design for a fly-trap, embracing the conical wire-gauze top A, cylindrical perforated box C, flanged ring D, inverted conical tubes E', and foot or standard E, as shown and described.
